## **BOBBY GORIN MEMORIAL**

In 1960, a year after Bobby Gorin's unfortunate death, his uncle Louis Gorin started the Bobby Gorin Memorial Golf Tournament at the Woodmont Country Club.

Prior to entering the University of North Carolina in 1959, Bobby had been a DC Junior Champion (1959) while attending Wilson High School, in northwest Washington, DC. In its inaugural year the 'Gorin' attracted 185 young golfers from locales as varied as California, New York, and Bermuda. In subsequent years the field grew until we were forced to limit the number of entries. Woodmont has remained the site of this tournament over the years thanks to the efforts of the late Club Professional Tony Marlowe, the late Frank Emmet, founder of the Junior Golfers of Washington, and the support of the current membership and professional staff. During the eighties the WMGA junior golf program thrived and gained recognition as a major tournament under the leadership of Bob Riley. Louis Gorin personally handmade each trophy and attended every tournament for nearly fifty years. He passed away in 2009. The Gorin family and the WMGA appreciates the continued sponsorship by the Woodmont Country Club for not only sponsoring this tournament but for remembering Bobby Gorin, a fine young man whose talent as a golfer was only exceeded by his compassion for his fellow players.

The format is 36 holes of stroke play over two days followed by match play. In the upper age brackets, the top 16 players advance to match play and two matches are scheduled on days three and four. In the 13 and under age bracket the top 8 players advance to match play, with two matches on day three, and the final match on day four. Over the years the championship has rotated between the North Course and the South Course, with it being held on the North for most of the last ten years.

The maximum age for players has varied, depending on whether a player was in high school or college. In 2017 the age eligibility was simplified, with the maximum age set at 18, and with no restrictions based on level of schooling.

In 2020, the 61st edition, was not held at Woodmont CC for the first time. Woodmont hosted the 2020 U. S. Women's Amateur the following week, and was unable to conduct the 'Gorin' due to logistical issues and course closures. The Chevy Chase Club stepped up to host the event to ensure that the tradition was carried on and to support the WMGA and junior golf.
